Private Lessons offer time to focus on challenges and issues specific to that particular instrument and student.... tutoring at its finest! Over the Christmas and winter break, your student may be less focused on their instrument, which is understandable. But by January, they should begin getting their "chops" back in shape to ensure a successful spring semester. Four private lessons in February (while the weather is too cold for outdoor rehearsals) will be a great opportunity to get them refocused, strong, and ready for full rehearsals. And remember - parents are a huge support by encouraging daily practice.
