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Registration

Second, instructors are planning for the upcoming semester and NN is purchasing materials. The sooner we know how many students to expect, the better prepared we can be for your student(s).

Late Registration

To avoid a late fee, online registration must be completed and a 20% deposit paid with payments scheduled/post-dated checks received by April 30th. (Or paid in full.)

Registration and payment received May 2 – June 15 will incur a \$40 late fee. Registration and payment received after June 16 will incur a \$60 late fee.

<u>Refund Policy</u>

Our Music Play class is for our youngest Nashville Notes musicians - ages 0-3 are welcome to participate with an accompanying parent and ages 4-5 are welcome to participate as a drop off (parents are still welcome!) In this class we focus on experiencing music through movement and activity.

-Each semester we learn about a composer of classical music while focusing on specific instruments of the orchestra, melodic direction of the tune, rhythmic elements, and more! We enjoy moving to music with scarves and ribbon streamers.

-Students also learn how to read rhythm notation while playing classroom instruments like rhythm sticks, bucket drums, Boomwhackers, and other unpitched percussion!

-Singing games are used as an important musical foundation skill with students learning solfege syllables and steady beat while having fun with their classmates.

As an Orff-Schulwerk certified and Kodaly trained teacher, I believe that laying a foundation for music starts in these young years as children experience moving to the steady beat and are introduced to music notation through Kodaly rhythm symbols and solfege. We focus on quarter note, quarter rest, and paired eighth notes. Students are also introduced to the full diatonic scale but singing games and activities focus on the intervals sol and mi. I look forward to seeing your child in class!

Additionally, they are expanding their aural skills with simple part-singing. Praise Station choir performs in a Christmas and spring concert.

All Praise Station Choir students are encouraged to take the corresponding Music Foundations class for a complete music education experience.

Our Praise Station Music Foundation class continues building on skills taught in Music Play and Grace Notes - students are taught quarter note, quarter rest, paired eighth notes, half notes, whole notes along with 16th notes. Students learn the solfege scale and aurally identify the sol-mi-la intervals along with the added tone set mi-re-do. As an Orff-Schulwerk and Kodaly trained teacher, I believe in the sequential process of teaching music skills through imitation, composition, and improvisation.

-Each semester we learn about a composer of classical music while focusing on specific instruments of the orchestra, melodic direction of the tune, rhythmic elements, and more! We enjoy moving to music with scarves and ribbon streamers.

-Rhythm and melody are performed in class with rhythm sticks, bucket drums, Boomwhackers, and other unpitched percussion!

-Praise Station Foundation students are required to have their own recorder for both semesters. In each semester we will spend 4-6 weeks learning traditional notation beginning with the treble clef notes B, A, and G. In the second semester we will also add the notes E, and D.

-Singing games are used as an important musical foundation skill with students singing solfege syllables and steady beat while having fun with their classmates.

We are not a performance group but we love having parents join us for an "informance" at the end of the semester, sharing some of our favorite activities from class.

*Included and in addition to rehearsal time: **Musicianship & Theory (M&T)** - a weekly 20 minute enrichment class to help students achieve a clear understanding of basic music theory.

The Bridge Choir continues to strengthen singing, rhythm, and aural skills while exploring more advanced musical concepts. Our repertoire includes rounds, partner songs, and two-part harmony – plus an introduction to singing in foreign languages! Students will also begin reading choral octavos at a basic level, and some lyric learning at home will be necessary to prepare for performances.

In addition to our Christmas and spring concerts, we may have an outside performance once a semester. Any extra performances will be communicated well in advance to ensure everyone is prepared and excited to participate.

Required Minimum Weekly Home Practice: 40 min./week

*Included and in addition to rehearsal time: **Musicianship & Theory (M&T)** - a weekly 20 minute enrichment class to help students achieve a clear understanding of basic music theory.

Singing 2, 3 and 4-part music, students continue learning and practicing healthy vocal technique and singing posture. Choristers learn about the changing voice and explore new ways of using their voices as they go through vocal transition. "Movable Do" solfeggio is used in order to build sight-reading skills and a strong emphasis on the development of listening skills essential for a high quality ensemble sound. We sing a variety of music styles in English as well as world music selections in other languages.

At this level students are expected to practice at home between rehearsals, logging their practice time daily into their notebooks. Daily vocalizing is expected of JH members; each singer's dedication to regular practice will strengthen individual vocal performance and thus improve the choir's sound. JH performs at the Christmas and Spring Concerts.

All choristers are expected to attend Choir Camp on the Saturday after the first rehearsal each semester, typically scheduled 10:00 – 3:00.

Required Minimum Weekly Home Practice: 2 hrs. (20 min./day)

<u>Instrumental</u>

Some Highlights

- New to a band instrument? (woodwinds, brass, or percussion) Or a strings instrument? (violin, viola, cello, double bass). Check out information about Beginner Band Camp and Beginner Strings Camp in June on pages 14 and 20, a proven method for getting a successful start – highly educational AND fun!! We look forward to having you join Novice Band or Prelude Strings!
- Have you been playing a band instrument for a couple years or more? You may be ready for Select Band! These musicians spend their time in full rehearsal as well as in sectionals, focused more on their particular instrument technique. This also includes an additional 20 minute Musicianship & Theory (M&T) class where the fundamentals of music theory are covered.
- There is a lot of intricate technique required when learning a stringed instrument, which is difficult to adequately address in a large group setting. Therefore, all violin, viola, cello, and double bass students are required to take private lessons throughout their participation in Prelude Strings, Andante Strings, and String Orchestra.
- Don't get hung up on ages for the instrumentalist! While choirs are determined by age due to physical vocal development, instrumental ensembles are not. They are determined by skill levels.

An Important Note About Tuners and Metronomes:

Tuners and metronomes are two of the most important tools in a musician's toolbox. They can be found in several ensembles' "Required Materials" list. These two items are worth some consideration.

They can be purchased as 2 separate tools, or 1 combined tool. Using separate tools allows for the musician to watch the tuner AND keep a metronome clicking. Since keeping a steady tempo AND intonation are both essential to progress, this is an excellent way to go!

These can also be accessed through apps on a mobile device or laptop. The "Tonal Energy Tuner" allows both to be accessed at the same time. (There are other options as well.) However, (and this is the important part to consider!) if the decision is to use an electronic version, consider all the distracting notifications that will flash across the top of the screen and potentially sabotage the musician's best efforts and plans! If using a mobile device is the choice to satisfy these required materials, the student needs to develop the habit of setting it to "airplane mode" during practice time. If this can become a habitual practice, a free or very inexpensive app is a great option!

NASHVILLE NOTES



Band Camp is an important element in preparing to participate in Novice Band. Campers experience focused instrumental and music theory instruction and also get a glimpse of the fun, social and interactive side of playing in an ensemble setting.

A beginning music student's progress will vary depending on many factors - motivation, frequency and quality of practice, quality of instrument, to name a few. After camp, students need a few private, one-on-one lessons to be prepared for Novice Band. Parents can expect an evaluation and consultation with their child's camp instructor to ensure proper preparation for band. Continuing private lessons once enrolled in Novice Band is an excellent choice, but not a requirement.

*Included and in addition to rehearsal time: **Musicianship & Theory (M&T)** - a weekly 20 minute enrichment class to help students achieve a clear understanding of basic music theory.

In this ensemble, students begin to systematically build upon the instrument foundations learned at camp and private lessons. They'll be guided towards excellent fundamentals, aimed at laying a solid foundation which can be built on reliably and successfully! Rehearsal time will cover central issues like instrument care and maintenance, embouchure, articulation, successful practice habits, breathing, posture, reading pitches and rhythms, following a conductor, and development of tone. And of course, fun band music! Novice Band performs at Christmas and spring concerts.

This ensemble is comprised of students who have already learned the basic fundamentals of their instrument. Incoming students, new to Novice Band, are expected to be able to play through page 8 of the band method book: *Sound Innovations bk 1.*

Because this level can consist of a wide range of skills not yet ready for the challenges of Select Band, NB students will likely separate into 2 groups. If this is required, the assistant directors who have directed NN bands for several years, will assist to better enable students to develop their skillset.

Recommended minimum age: 10

- Required Materials: instrument, instrument supplies, black or silver music stand, metronome, and tuner.
- Required Band method book: Sound Innovations, book 1 (the blue book, instrument specific)
- Minimum Weekly Home Practice Requirements: 2 hrs./wk. Must be logged and turned in each week.

In order to achieve success in a novice instrumentalist's musical journey of discovery, exploration, and discipline, all students enrolled in Novice Band are strongly encouraged to also enroll in choir, especially if playing a brass instrument.

Welcome to our Select Band, the next destination for students after meeting the standards covered in Novice Band. In Select Band, students rehearse and perform alongside all the families of instruments - brass, woodwinds, and percussion together in the standard "band" configuration! In this more diverse musical setting, they learn to balance their individual contributions by supporting an exciting, multi-faceted team. Students explore and learn more about what their particular instrument does in an ensemble and the characteristic roles of others. In rehearsal, students are led through the challenges of the music, given focused instruction to practice at home, and encouraged towards personal responsibility and development–all under the watchful eye of our esteemed and experienced conducting staff. All of these efforts culminate in a performance each semester that celebrates the students' hard work and development.

Eligibility: Students will be asked to demonstrate their current level of proficiency by:

- 1. playing 2 major scales of their choice,
 - 2. playing a full range of notes by ½ step (chromatically) from the lowest note to the highest note they are able to play.
 - 3. Demonstrating their instrument skills by playing music of their choice.

This ensemble is designed to guide students in an exploration of jazz through both performance and research of its history, iconic compositions and performers. Students gain familiarity and orientation in the rich history of jazz and its associated subgenres as they study and perform music from the rich library of the jazz tradition, from Louis Armstrong and New Orleans' "Second Line" to Miles Davis and the Birth of the Cool, from big band swing to bebop, Cuban music, R&B and beyond! Our primary focus is on improvisation, as students learn to express themselves according to their imagination and unique musical voice. Students receive tools to train their ears and minds to realize and perform their own creative intentions as they work to cultivate an authentic jazz "voice", which means developing a personal and expressive tone, emphasizing rhythmic feel and timing, and studying transcriptions of great solos. They also study popular song forms, including the 12-bar Blues format, and the 32-bar Great American popular song style. Advanced students can expect to be offered gigs outside of Nashville Notes regular concert programming.

Students should expect to practice for at least two hours a week in this class. By Audition Only.

Prelude Strings is a beginner orchestra for students ages 7 and up who have been playing violin, viola, cello, or double bass for a minimum of 2 months. We perform levels 1 works for strings that are designed to guide players through the fundamentals, develop their musicality, and foster ensemble-playing skills. Although this ensemble is non-auditioned, there is a lot of intricate technique required when learning a stringed instrument, which is difficult to adequately address in a large group setting. Therefore, all students are required to take private lessons for a minimum of 2 months leading up to enrollment, and throughout their participation in Prelude Strings. This ensemble is not a required pre-requisite to Andante Strings, though it is a great fit for students that are new to a stringed instrument and need to delve into essential techniques such as proper posture, bowing, finger placement, and intonation – all of which will lay the groundwork for their participation in both Andante Strings and String Orchestra going forward.

Andante Strings is an intermediate orchestra for students ages 8 and up who have been playing violin, viola, cello, or double bass for a minimum of 1 year. There is a lot of intricate technique required when learning a stringed instrument, which is difficult to adequately address in a large group setting. Therefore, **all students are required to take private lessons**. We perform levels 1.5 and 2 works for strings that are designed to help students at the intermediate level hone their skills in rhythm, intonation, and ensemble-playing. This ensemble is not a required pre-requisite to String Orchestra, though it is a great fit for students who are new to playing in an orchestra to get the experience they need to thrive in String Orchestra in the future.

String Orchestra is an advanced orchestra for students who have been playing violin, viola, cello, or double bass for a minimum of 2 years. There is a lot of intricate technique required when learning a stringed instrument, which is difficult to adequately address in a large group setting. Therefore, **all students are required to take private lessons**. We perform levels 3 and 4 works for string orchestra, which makes an excellent adjunct to their private studies once a student reaches level 3 proficiency or higher. String Orchestra is perfect for students who have some experience playing in an orchestra and can handle more advanced repertoire as well as a longer rehearsal time. Students at this level should be able to tune their own instrument, shift into both second and third positions, and use vibrato.

Students at Nashville Notes in instrumental and choral ensembles designated with an asterisk, receive instruction in the essential topics of music theory and aural skills as part of their education to help them develop as a holistic musician. A short assessment is given the first day of class. If a student feels they have the theory skills necessary to test out of M&T, there is a longer exam that will be given on the first day and will require a test score of at least 80%.

Scale Your Knowledge of Scales(beyond M&T)Vera Morgan

The purpose of this course is twofold. First: to solidify and deepen the students' knowledge of major and minor key signatures and scales which they encounter within the context of Western classical music in their ensembles. Second: to expose them to other scales that have been used since the era of the Gregorian chant, in the 20th century classical music, in other genres and/or in other cultures (modes, chromatic and whole-tone scale, pentatonic scale, blues scale, etc.). Students will learn to identify these in a written form, and will be given an opportunity to hear the differences when played on an instrument. Examples will also be given from compositions that are utilizing these keys.
